We continue to be busy in the sixth grade as we enter the month of February. Here are some highlights of areas we have been studying.

In history we have just completed a short unit about the barbarian Franks and the Holy Roman Empire. We now turn to the Middle Ages, an era sometimes referred to as the Dark Ages.
